A challenge for all sections



1st Waddington Rangers' Toilet Roll Challenge

A challenge badge for all sections, having fun with toilet roll tubes!

We have created this challenge badge for all the members of Guiding who love to make things, be creative, play games and have fun outdoors, all very cheaply and whilst recycling one very important item – the humble toilet roll tube!

There are lots of activities which we have tried and tested, so we hope you will enjoy them as much as we have!

The challenge consists of 6 sections:

- Section 1:** Art
- Section 2:** Crafts
- Section 3:** Games
- Section 4:** Guiding
- Section 5:** Seasonal
- Section 6:** Outdoors

To complete the challenge we suggest that:

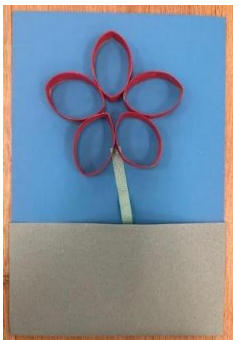
Rainbows & Brownies complete one challenge from each section
Guides, Rangers & adults complete two challenges from each section



Art



Dip the end of a toilet roll in green paint and use it to print this cute caterpillar.



Cut a toilet roll into narrow rings (approx. 1cm). Paint or colour them, then pinch them into petal shapes and stick them onto paper to create a beautiful flower.



Pinch the end of a toilet roll tube to make a leaf shape and dip it in red, yellow, orange, brown and green paint to make an autumnal tree picture.

Cut the ends of toilet roll tubes in different widths and shapes and then splay the sections outwards. Use them to create lots of different art:





Crafts



Make a pen pot. We styled this one to be a castle, but yours could be anything you like!



Make a racing car. Use the end of a toilet roll as the template for the wheels and carefully cut out a small rectangle to fold back and make the cockpit. Why not paint them different colours and have a race?



Paint or cover a toilet roll, pinch in the ends and wrap with a ribbon to make a beautiful gift box.



Use clever cutting to make a free-standing flower using one of these two designs.



Make a space rocket. Use two or three toilet rolls (or a kitchen roll) for its body. Then make several long cuts down the length of the toilet roll (not quite all the way to the end) and overlap the long strips to make a point for the nose of the rocket.



Put beads or rice inside a toilet roll tube and cover the ends with greaseproof paper to make a rainmaker or maraca.



Make a variety of animals from toilet rolls to create a safari scene. You could even use them as characters to tell a story in a puppet show or stop motion animation.

Make a favourite character by using leftover craft materials to decorate your toilet roll tube:





Games



Use six or ten toilet rolls to play skittles.



Use toilet rolls to make a tower. Who can build it the tallest or fastest?



Have an egg and spoon race, balancing a ball on top of your toilet roll tube.



Stick a piece of string inside a toilet roll tube and seal one end. Make a ladybird or fly for the end of the string and decorate the tube to look like a frog. Can you make the frog catch the insect?



Can you balance a ball on a toilet roll tube on your forehead?

(This caused a lot of hilarity amongst our Rangers!)



Cut toilet rolls in half, paint them and write numbers on them. Lay them out on the floor or table and try to bounce a ping pong ball into them. Score points according to which tube it lands in.



Tape toilet rolls together to make a cricket bat or hockey stick and try a toilet roll version of one of these sports.

You may want to make a ball by bunching together toilet paper – when we tried a tennis ball, the bat didn't last long!



Cut and number toilet roll tubes and stick them inside a box to create a labyrinth game to play with a ping pong ball.



Guiding



Paint a toilet roll tube to make a Guide, Brownie or other member. You could even make a whole Guiding family!



Paint a toilet roll tube and add a cloud and coloured ribbons or tissue paper to create a Rainbow decoration.



Stuff a toilet roll tube with tumble dryer link and use it to start a campfire!



Cut a toilet roll in half lengthways and pinch the end inwards. Dip it in yellow paint and print it six times to make the trefoil shape of the World Badge. Use a paintbrush to draw the rest of the badge. Do you know what each part of the badge represents?



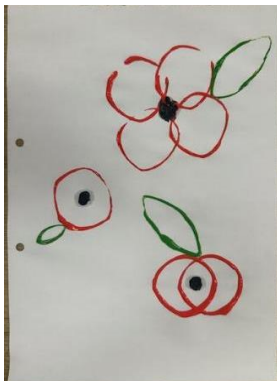
Seasonal



Pinch the end of a toilet roll tube inwards to make a heart shape. Then, dip it in red paint to make this beautiful bouquet of flowers for Mothers' Day or Valentine's Day.



Paint a toilet roll white and decorate it to make this cute snowman.



Dip the ends of toilet rolls in red and green paint and then use it to print this poppies for remembrance.



Paint poppies on a toilet roll to make a remembrance toilet roll!



Use four toilet rolls cut to size and painted to make a 3D Christmas tree.



Dip the end of a toilet roll in white paint and use it to print this festive snowman.



Create a candle decoration for Christmas Diwali, Holi or another festival.



Shape the end of a toilet roll tube. Then, dip it in white or brown paint to make cute bunny rabbits for an Easter card.



Colour a toilet roll tube to look like a chimney pot. Cut out a pair of red legs and pop them in the top to make Santa falling down the chimney!



Use two toilet roll tubes, a red button or pompom and some cardboard to make a standing Rudolph. You could even go outside and gather sticks to make his antlers and legs.



Cut a circle of green paper, cut a slit in it and wrap it round to make a cone. Decorate it to look like a Christmas tree and balance it on a toilet roll tube stump to make it stand up.



Celebrate spring by planting flowers. Make a compostable flower pot by folding the bottom inwards, then filling it with soil. Plant some seeds in it and when they start to grow, you can plant the whole pot in the garden.
